

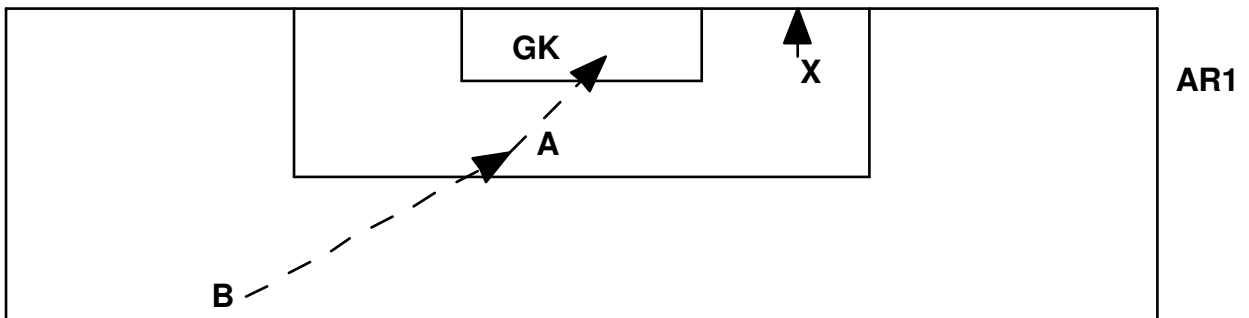
**Questions 58 through 64 describe situations in which there could be an offside infringement. Assume in each situation that no other player is anywhere close to the action.**

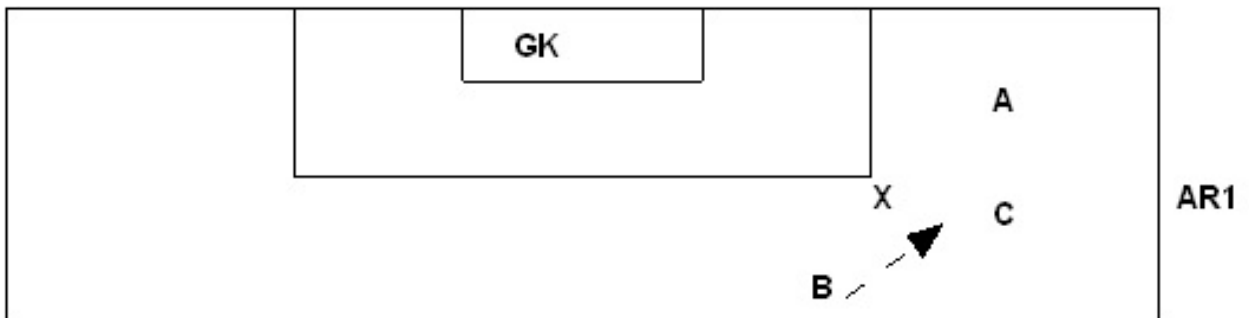
58 An attacking player A is injured and lying on the ground inside the field of play. Another attacker B, defended by X, shoots the ball towards the goal.



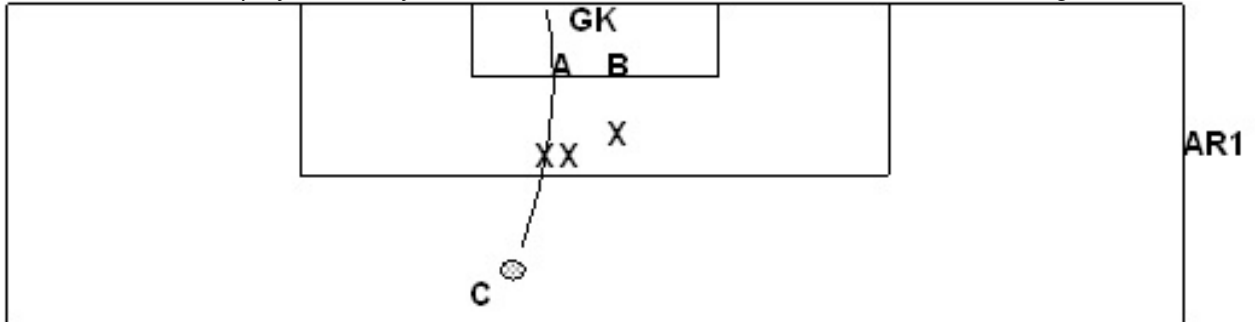
59 Defender X leaves the field of play in an attempt to put player A into an offside position. Player B passes the ball to player A, who heads the ball, past the goalkeeper GK, into the net.



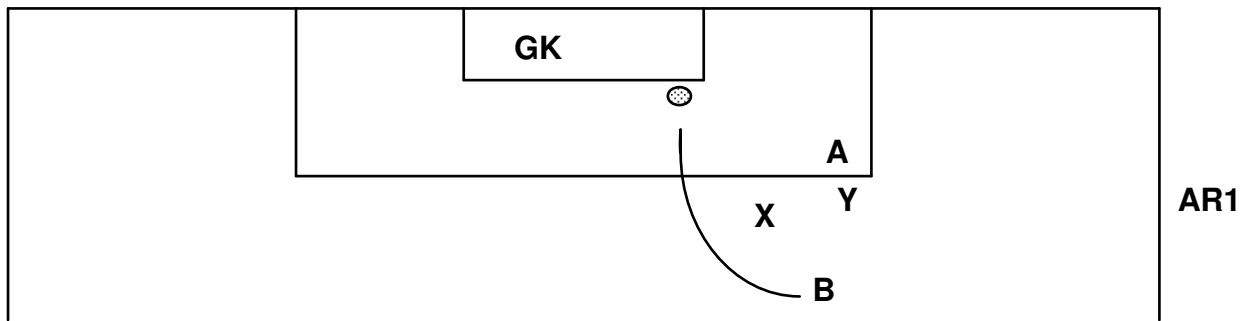
60 Player B passes the ball to teammate C who is being defended by player X. Player A is a teammate of B and C. Player A remains stationary.



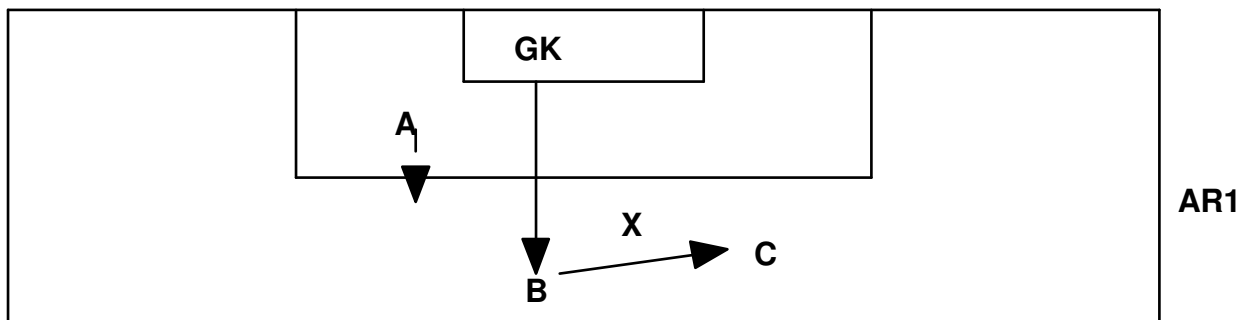
- 61 Players A and B are standing near the top of the goal area while a free kick is taken by their teammate, player C. Players A and B do not move and the free kick results in a goal.



- 62 Players A and B are attackers; Players X and Y are defenders. Player B plays the ball past X (on the inside) and then runs around X (on X's other side) onto the ball to play it again. Player A does not interfere.



- 63 The ball was played to the goalkeeper by a teammate and, since he/she could not use his/her hands, attacking player A challenged him/her. The goalkeeper then kicked the ball and player A started to run up field. The ball was cleared to another attacker B who then played the ball to a teammate C who was being defended by X.



64 Players A, B, and C are teammates; player X is a defender. Player C attempts to pass the ball to B but it is deflected by defender X to Player A.
